

THE LIBRARY CLOSING: A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

March 20, 2020

UPDATE: The library system will be closed until further notice. Please don't return any items you have to any dropbox until we reopen. Fines have been suspended.

As news of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak continues to evolve, Brockton Public Library is taking new steps to help ensure the health and safety of its staff, visitors, and community.

At the recommendation of the Mayor and the Trustees, **Brockton Public Library will now be closed until further notice.** We did not arrive at this decision easily – please know that while we are aware of the impact on our community, including the loss of access to in-person services and gathering spaces, we choose to close the library after lengthy discussions with the Mayor and other City departments.

HOLDS

Don't worry about your items on the hold shelf. Anything that's on the hold shelves when we close will still be there when we reopen.

DUE DATES

Don't worry about your items you have out. We are in the process of changing all due dates to **April 30** for now. **Please don't return any items you have to the dropbox until we reopen.**

REQUESTS

You'll still be able to place requests during the closure, but no items will be pulled to fill requests during the closure.
