



SMART Recovery is an evidenced-informed recovery method grounded in Rational Emotive Behavioral Therapy (REBT) and Cognitive Behavioral Therapy (CBT), that supports people with substance dependencies or problem behaviors to:

- Build and maintain motivation**
- Cope with urges and cravings**
- Manage thoughts, feelings and behaviors**
- Live a balanced life**







His poems have been translated into German, Japanese, Polish, and Spanish. In English, his poems and prose have appeared widely in anthologies such as *The Best American Poetry* and *Blood to Remember: American Poets on the Holocaust*, among many other places. As managing editor of Hanging Loose Press, he has published four anthologies of the "Best Poetry" by high school age writers.




Student Poet
